Governor's Budget

Governor Newsom has released the January 2023/24 State Budget Proposal which is supportive of California Community Colleges. The Governor has created a roadmap that focuses on equity and student success. SRJC is focused on dual enrollment with all of our local high schools. Ongoing funding proposals in the Governor's budget includes an 8.13 percent COLA. The budget, including the COLA, is to be negotiated during the SEIU and the Districts negotiations process. 
